AN ACTION PLAN FOR PENNSYLVANIA'S GENERAL ELECTION - IN BRIEF

The global spread of COVID-19 is causing massive disruptions to nearly all aspects of everyday life. It is constitutionally imperative that Pennsylvania—and the rest of the United States—hold an election in November.

Bold action is needed on nearly every front here in Pennsylvania, in the United States, and around the world. As health and economic systems feel the strain of this crisis, so too will our democratic systems. With this in mind, we must begin today to plan for a safe, fair, accessible, and secure general election in November.

RECOMMENDED ACTION ITEMS

- HOLD THE GENERAL
 ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 3
- 5 AVOID ADOPTION OF ONLINE VOTING
- 2 EXPAND VOTE BY MAIL
- 6 REVISIT CONTINGENCY PLANNING
- PREPARE POLLING PLACES
 AND POLL WORKERS
- PREVENT BACKSLIDING ON ELECTION SECURITY PROGRESS
- EDUCATE VOTERS AND COMBAT DISINFORMATION
- SUPPORT FEDERAL FUNDING AND ACTION

These recommendations are difficult and expensive to implement. But they are necessary to protect the health of Pennsylvania's voters and our democracy.
